### Pieced Border Option Only

This is a fairly intricate border for which we have completed the work over several months. The following should clarify the instructions.

#### Part 2: From the following baggies...

Remove from:	Baggie H	Baggie J
Lazy Lap	136 pcs. (0 pcs will remain in baggie)	72 pcs. (0 pcs will remain in baggie)
Quaintly Queen	224 pcs. (8 pcs will remain in baggie)	112 pcs. (0 pcs will remain in baggie)

#### **Page 5:**

2. Join Unit 2's together with (1) Unit 1 on each end to make 4 border strips using the chart below as a guide to the number of Four Patches used in each strip. When making these diagonal strips make sure that the Four Patches create the line pattern as shown in the diagram. Pin and match seams very carefully before stitching. Each border strip should use the number of Four Patches as indicated below: ...

#### **Note from Sherri:**

The number of Four Patches for each border strip listed is correct mathematically and has been tested by several sewers for the size of quilt given. As sewing does differ from quilter to quilter, as well as fabric characteristics and pressing, etc. and you discover the border strip is shorter or longer than required you may have to adjust a few seams evenly along the strip. If the measurement is out more than expected and this is consistent on the opposite side of the quilt, adding or removing a Four Patch is certainly allowed. But please make sure that in doing this the added border will continue to lay flat and not 'wave'. The measurement of the quilt center once Border 4 is added should remain consistent with the pattern.
